Missourians will have education and resources available to them to keep them safe; free from abuse, neglect, and exploitation; and to help them plan for their financial security in retirement.

Older Americans Act (OAA) Reauthorization

Understanding the OAA

Established in 1965 to support older adults in remaining independent.

Funds a range of services including nutrition programs, caregiver support, and elder rights protection.

Significantly more administrative complexities written into the reauthorization (pending U.S. House approval).

Federal funding administered through the Missouri Department of Health and Human Services, State Unit on Aging.

• Current challenge: State appropriation (spending) authority for existing federal fund.



Conclusion

The Region 7 Area Plan reflects MARC's unwavering commitment to healthy aging and access to quality services.
